1	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Approval of the draft		
2	minutes of October 18th. [Res. #21-11-01]		
3	DIRECTOR LEVY: All 44 pages of it, I so		
4	move.		
5	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Seconded?		
6	DIRECTOR JOHNEAS: Second.		
7	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: All in a favor?		
8	(Whereupon all members responded in the		
9	affirmative.)		
10	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Any abstentions?		
11	(No response.)		
12	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Approval of the Abstract		
13	of Claims? [Res. #21-11-02]		
14	DIRECTOR LEVY: I have a couple of questions,		
15	one of them on page three: Lockheed Martin		
16	breach of contract, \$10,700.		
17	What is that?		
18	MR. LIMMER: That's the litigation that Brian		
19	explained, I think two meetings back, the		
20	discovery. The \$10 million dollar lawsuit.		
21	DIRECTOR LEVY: Okay.		
22	MS. FLYNN: Brian reviewing the invoices, all		
23	the documents.		
24	DIRECTOR LEVY: The last thing: On page		
25	four, \$124,000, 80% of office, we're paying or		

1	we're waiting for the insurance to reimburse us?	
2	How is this working?	
3	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: Correct.	
4	We are covered by insurance as we are not in a	
5	FEMA flood zone. So we have submitted to	
6	insurance and we have had already our original	
7	conversation with FEMA and another call for the	
8	29th of this month. So we are hoping for 100%	
9	coverage between insurance and FEMA.	
10	DIRECTOR LEVY: Okay. So how long you going	
11	to be in the hole before you start getting	
12	reimbursement from the insurance?	
13	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: Not sure. Judy	
14	provided them with a spreadsheet about a week to	
15	ten days ago. We told them it was a running	
16	sheet, we didn't want to provide it to them	
17	earlier but they said just give us what you	
18	have. Now it's a running sheet.	
19	DIRECTOR LEVY: Our fiscal year runs January	
20	to December. I just want to make sure that we	
21	get the reimbursement so we don't have to	
22	move make changes from right to left to	
23	expend it in one year and then see the	
24	reimbursement in '22.	
25	MS. FLYNN: I'll make sure I follow-up with	

1	the insurance company aggressively.		
2	DIRECTOR LEVY: Okay.		
3	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: So moved? Approval?		
4	DIRECTOR LEVY: I so move.		
5	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Seconded?		
6	DIRECTOR FRANK: Second.		
7	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Thank you, Carol.		
8	All in favor?		
9	(Whereupon all members responded in the		
10	affirmative.)		
11	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Any abstentions?		
12	(No response.)		
13	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Treasurer's Monthly		
14	Report.		
15	Anything unusual?		
16	MS. FLYNN: Nothing unusual to report.		
17	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: A motion to accept.		
18	[Res. #21-11-03]		
19	DIRECTOR LEVY: I so move.		
20	DIRECTOR FRANK: Second.		
21	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: All in favor?		
22	(Whereupon all members responded in the		
23	affirmative.)		
24	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Any abstentions?		
25	(No response.)		

1	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: You have 1.4 Approval,	
2	everyone has seen it, of the updated budget, a	
3	letter from the engineer?	
4	MS. FLYNN: Yes. We updated the 2022 budget	
5	to include the interest expense that will be	
6	incurred in 2022 from the new WIIA loan and we	
7	are still well above the requirement of the	
8	110%.	
9	DIRECTOR LEVY: You're talking about 1.4, the	
10	CDM Smith letter?	
11	MS. FLYNN: Yes.	
12	DIRECTOR FRANK: I have a budget question.	
13	I notice that the gas, gasoline and diesel	
14	was the same for this year and next year and I'm	
15	wondering if these increased gasoline prices are	
16	going to factor into that, or at least if it's	
17	projected that we are going to be under-spending	
18	for that. I think it was \$42,000.	
19	DIRECTOR LEVY: Start using bicycles.	
20	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: Carol,	
21	when we put this budget together it was August	
22	and September before the gas prices took off to	
23	where they are at. We are late with the	
24	budget not late, we're getting late with the	
25	budget. This WIIA thing was a last second	

1	addition we put in.	
2	Trying to find that page right now.	
3	DIRECTOR FRANK: I forget what page. It's	
4	under operating expenses.	
5	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: So through	
6	July 31st we are at \$22,000, basically over half	
7	of the budget through seven months. So we	
8	should come in somewhere around the full budget,	
9	maybe a little bit less now that the gas	
10	prices but we'll have to see. Gas prices are	
11	sometimes cyclical, they could come back down	
12	next spring, summer as well.	
13	DIRECTOR LEVY: You're kidding, right?	
14	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: Well, we have to be	
15	hopeful.	
16	DIRECTOR LEVY: Pipeline will be open,	
17	refineries will be aligned.	
18	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: I think you are	
19	hallucinating, Dan.	
20	DIRECTOR LEVY: No, I don't see it going	
21	down, but Greg does.	
22	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: It's not going down. Not	
23	the way things are going.	
24	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: We can adjust it.	
25	DIRECTOR LEVY: Some changes, nothing is	

1	going to change.	
2	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: We could do a budget	
3	transfer if need be.	
4	MS. FLYNN: Later in the year.	
5	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: Because it changes	
6	CDM's letter and so forth which we don't have	
7	time for; the budget has to be sent out to the	
8	state. But we will monitor it and we'll see what	
9	happens.	
10	DIRECTOR FRANK: I'm sure you will.	
11	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Motion to approve the	
12	updated budget with the letter from the	
13	engineer. [Res. #21-11-04]	
14	DIRECTOR LEVY: I so move.	
15	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Seconded?	
16	DIRECTOR JOHNEAS: Second.	
17	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: All in favor?	
18	(Whereupon all members responded in the	
19	affirmative.)	
20	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Any abstentions?	
21	(No response.)	
22	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Greg, revised certificate.	
23	MS. FLYNN: Again, we just updated the	
24	certificate to reflect the new calculation.	
25	CHAIRMAN KAI NICK: Correct.	

1	MS. FLYNN: So we just need an approval, a	
2	resolution so that I can send it to the	
3	Trustees.	
4	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Motion to approve.	
5	[Res. #21-11-05]	
6	DIRECTOR LEVY: Sorry, I didn't get it. What	
7	are we approving?	
8	MR. LIMMER: The certificate based upon the	
9	revised budget; the revised certificate that has	
10	to go to the trustees pursuant to the bond	
11	resolution.	
12	DIRECTOR LEVY: Okay. I so move.	
13	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Seconded?	
14	DIRECTOR LUSTBADER: Second.	
15	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: All in favor?	
16	(Whereupon all members responded in the	
17	affirmative.)	
18	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Any abstentions?	
19	(No response.)	
20	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Budget Transfer Request.	
21	Greg, do you want to explain the situation	
22	with the compressor that we have?	
23	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: Yes. We	
24	have one main utility truck which is out for	
25	repair right now. We have a backup utility	

1	truck that's going to be 20 years old next year.	
2	Mike ordered a replacement truck for this year	
3	but he has still not been given a delivery date.	
4	They're talking about a 2023 model due to the	
5	chip shortage. That backup utility truck also pulls	
6	an 18 to 19 year old compressor so we want to	
7	purchase a new towable compressor. Mike is	
8	renting one tomorrow as we are running into the	
9	main break season, we do not want to have one	
10	piece of equipment to try to handle main breaks	
11	and have a failure.	
12	There was, I guess, about a one-week to	
13	ten-day lead time just to rent a compressor.	
14	This type of equipment is becoming harder and	
15	harder to find and the new compressor that we	
16	are asking the budget transfer to purchase has	
17	about a seven-month lead time to get a new	
18	compressor.	
19	DIRECTOR LEVY: How much is a new compressor?	
20	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: I am asking for a	
21	\$55,000 budget transfer from the Middle Neck	
22	Road Water Main Project.	
23	We are getting estimates as we speak now,	
24	but\$55,000 will be able to handle, more than handle,	
25	what we need.	

1	DIRECTOR LEVY: Are you talkii	ng about	
2	the towable one?		
3	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: Yes, th	ne towable	
4	one. They didn't have them back when we had		
5	the compressor we have now, but what Mike is	the compressor we have now, but what Mike is	
6	getting is one that will have an on-board	getting is one that will have an on-board	
7	generator as well which will be able to run our	generator as well which will be able to run our	
8	lights at night and so forth and other equipment.	lights at night and so forth and other equipment.	
9	Obviously if we have a main break at night,		
10	which seems to happen usually at that time, we	which seems to happen usually at that time, we	
11	can set up plenty of lighting and so forth so that's	can set up plenty of lighting and so forth so that's	
12	going to add to the price. It's not going to be just	going to add to the price. It's not going to be just	
13	a compressor but a compressor/generator that	a compressor but a compressor/generator that	
14	will be able to be towed behind any one of our		
15	vehicles, pickup trucks, utility trucks,	vehicles, pickup trucks, utility trucks,	
16	et cetera.		
17			
18	DIRECTOR JOHNEAS: Great idea.		
19	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Motion to appr	ove.	
20	[Res. 21-11-06]		
21	DIRECTOR LEVY: I so move.		
22	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Seconded?		
23	DIRECTOR FRANK: Second.		
24	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: All in favor?		
25	(Whereupon all members responded in th	e	

1	affirmative.)		
2	CHAIRMAN KALNICK:	Any abstentions?	
3	(No response.)		
4	CHAIRMAN KALNICK:	Judy, do you want to talk	
5	about the new credit card vendor	s?	
6	MS. FLYNN: Sure. So	we have quite a few	
7	people that are paying by credit ca	ard or by	
8	check. This year we noticed there was an		
9	18% increase in this type of payment so we		
10	decided to take a look to see if we can find a		
11	cheaper option for our customers.		
12	Currently the customers are paying through		
13	Paymentus, \$5.95 for every \$750 increment. So		
14	with the new company that we found, it's called		
15	Smart Energy Water, they are wil	ling to do	
16	a couple of different things: The		
17	first would be if the bill is \$200 or	under	
18	there will only be a \$2.50 charge to pay your bill		
19	with the credit card; or if the bill is		
20	over \$200, then it's a \$4.95 transaction fee for		
21	every \$1,000, so it's a bit cheaper. And then		
22	if they pay by check it would only be 95 cents cost		
23	to pay the entire bill up to \$25,000		
24	by check online.		
25	DIRECTOR LEVY:	Judy, why does pay by	

1	check cost money? Pay by check, shouldn't
2	be free?
3	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: There is always a
4	convenience fee.
5	Sorry Judy.
6	DIRECTOR LEVY: I am not sending you a paper
7	check.
8	MR. LIMMER: It's an e-check as opposed to a
9	regular check.
10	DIRECTOR FRANK: It's not a regular check.
11	MS. FLYNN: You just put your routing number
12	and account number online.
13	You don't need a special check. It's just
14	putting your check information on their online
15	system.
16	DIRECTOR LUSTBADER: That's how taxes are
17	paid in Nassau County. If you pay by e-check for
18	your Nassau County property tax, it's \$2.
19	MS. FLYNN: \$1.95. I looked at another
20	vendor and they are charging 3% of the entire bill if
21	you pay by credit card
22	or a \$1.95 for the e-check.
23	The other thing that this company will do is
24	the website. Customers will be able to print their
25	bill online and

1	they can also sign up for the electronic billing
2	and that's all included with the charges that
3	the customers are paying for their
4	transactions.
5	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: I would really
6	like to commend Judy. She worked very hard on
7	this and negotiated back and forth and she
8	actually pitted one company against the other
9	and tried to get that fee reduced as far as possible,
10	especially since ours is an aging, somewhat aging
11	community and the minimum bill is \$75. For the
12	people who have those smaller bills, she worked
13	very hard to get that charge reduced down as far
14	as possible.
15	So I would like to commend Judy for that
16	work. Thank you, Judy.
17	DIRECTOR FRANK: I think that's very good. I
18	remember years ago when there was an increase, a
19	lot of the people who were at that lowest rung
20	of usage were the ones who complained the most
21	at that time.
22	MS. FLYNN: Right. That's why we wanted to
23	try to get them an option that if they didn't
24	have the liquid money, to pay by check at
25	least it would only cost \$2.50 to pay by credit

1	card.
2	We also have a few customers that have to
3	wait for their Social Security check and it
4	isn't always timed correctly for them.
5	DIRECTOR LUSTBADER: Judy, would this be an
6	app or you go right to a website to pay?
7	MS. FLYNN: It could be both. You could pay
8	by website or you can actually get an app on your
9	phone and you can pay by text.
10	Once you sign up for the website, you can
11	also put in for the website to remind you to pay
12	your bill. If you want to pay it closer to the due
13	date, so they will either
14	call you or you can either get an automated call
15	two or three days before the bill is due or on
16	the day the bill is due or you can get a text.
17	And they can also pay, believe it or not, at
18	CVS, 7-Eleven or Family Dollar store somehow,
19	and you can use Apple Pay, G Pay, PayPal or
20	Venmo.
21	DIRECTOR LUSTBADER: And if you use Venmo,
22	there is still the processing fee even if you
23	use your own Venmo account?
24	MS. FLYNN: Yes. I guess that's the way
25	they are making money, because we are not paying

1	them any fees to host the site.
2	DIRECTOR LEVY: How about Zelle if you bank
3	out of Chase, can you pay them by Zelle?
4	MS. FLYNN: They didn't mention Zelle. I
5	will follow-up and let you know.
6	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Motion to approve the
7	proposal? [Res. #21-11-07]
8	DIRECTOR LUSTBADER: Move to approve.
9	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Seconded?
10	DIRECTOR JOHNEAS: Second.
11	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: All in favor?
12	(Whereupon all members responded in the
13	affirmative.)
14	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Any abstentions?
15	(No response.)
16	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Keith.
17	MR. KELLY: Good afternoon or good evening.
18	Everyone has the Engineer's Report. Do
19	you have any questions, do you want me to go
20	through anything specific?
21	(No response.)
22	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: No questions? Okay.
23	Greg?
24	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: I just want to provide an update
25	on the treatment project at Watermill Lane. Temporary

1	electric for the construction equipment has been
2	set up. Vibration monitoring has been set up.
3	On our existing structure at 2-A, 11-A, booster
4	station, ground storage tank and existing generator,
5	all the sheeting has been completed around the new
6	building location. The
7	contractor submitted pile calculations. They
8	requested a different type of pile be driven.
9	We are waiting for that to still be worked out
10	and how much credit to the Authority will be
11	given.
12	The existing PSEG pole has been rerouted with
13	new primary cables. The electrical duct bank
14	and generator foundation and re-bar, et cetera
15	has all been formed and poured.
16	Today they were doing additional excavation
17	two feet further down and they are investigating
18	dewatering. The DEC is talking about if they
19	exceed a certain amount of dewatering for the
20	site. A permit was filed with the DEC but the
21	DEC is looking at the watering pumps anywhere
22	from eight to nine months out.
23	So this process with the piles and we are
24	talking looking at raising the building up
25	potentially to get further out of the

1	groundwater depending on what cost factors are
2	involved with that. We may not even need the
3	DEC dewatering permit. This is a very, very wet
4	site on the opposite side where the main office
5	is.
6	The carbon vessels are still on track to be
7	delivered after January 1, 2022 and the Trojan
8	system for the UV is estimated at January 28th
9	for delivery.
10	So the project is moving along on schedule at
11	this time and all is well with this contractor.
12	Any questions on treatment?
13	(No response.)
14	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: Next item:
15	I have been talking to the attorney for Verizon
16	Wireless about the corral that I've mentioned to
17	the Board at previous board meetings, for the
18	antennas on the elevated tank at Weybridge Road.
19	This guy is very, very good. He helps bring
20	all the cell carriers, contact all the cell
21	carriers for me, get them on board hopefully.
22	So they are interested in a conceptual sketch
23	and as you see in your board packet from H2M,
24	\$6,800 not to exceed for H2M to develop a
25	conceptual sketch of what each cell carrier

1	would look like on the corral. And what's very,
2	very important to the cell carriers is their
3	azimuth. Right now they have their antennas on
4	the tank. Azimuth is the degree in which an
5	angle, which their antennas are actually
6	projecting out their signal. So they want to
7	make sure their as azimuths do not change going
8	up on a corral. Which does not appear will be
9	the case but until this conceptual sketch is
10	done, that can't be 100% given.
11	So I recommend to the Board to approve this
12	proposal from H2M not to exceed \$6,800 on the
13	condition that the cell carriers put up the money to
14	pay for it prior to moving forward each time. [Res.
15	#21-11-08]
16	Any questions?
17	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Steve, we don't need a
18	resolution on this, correct?
19	MR. LIMMER: Yes, you do. You do because
20	it's approving it subject to the carriers
21	agreeing to pay the money but it's still
22	something you are paying even though you're
23	being reimbursed for it.
24	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Got it. Motion to
25	approve?

1	DIRECTOR LEVY: So moved.
2	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Seconded?
3	DIRECTOR JOHNEAS: Second.
4	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: All in favor?
5	(Whereupon all members responded in the
6	affirmative.)
7	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Any abstentions?
8	(No response.)
9	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: 2.2(c) is a
10	negative declaration for the WIIA Grant for
11	Storm Mitigation AOP project at Watermill Lane. We
12	have done all of the SEQRA, lead agency, et cetera,
13	and this
14	is the last piece that's needed. Sue sent off
15	the application last week and they have accepted the
16	application. We are thinking around January we will
17	hear on that potential grant money.
18	This is the last piece: providing a negative
19	declaration.
20	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Motion to approve?
21	DIRECTOR JOHNEAS: Motion. [Res. #21-11-09]
22	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Thank you, Jay.
23	Seconded?
24	DIRECTOR LUSTBADER: Second.
25	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Thank you, Dana.

1	All in favor?
2	(Whereupon all members responded in the
3	affirmative.)
4	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Any abstentions?
5	(No response.)
6	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Item d has been tabled.
7	I don't know if you want to discuss it or just
8	table it?
9	SUPERINTENDENT GRAZIANO: Just table it,
10	please.
11	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Steve, 70 Beach Road.
12	Should we go into Executive Session for
13	advice of counsel?
14	MR. LIMMER: It might involve litigation
15	since it's a claim so we should go into
16	Executive Session.
17	CHAIRMAN Motion to go into
18	KALNICK: executive session? Res. #21-11-10
19	DIRECTOR LEVY: So moved.
20	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Second?
21	DIRECTOR LUSTBADER: Second.
22	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: All in favor?
23	(Whereupon all members responded in the
24	affirmative.)
25	CHAIRMAN KAI NICK: Any abstentions?

1	(No response.)
2	(Whereupon the board went into Executive
3	Session at 6:24 P.M.)
4	(At 7:02 P.M. the Board returned from Executive Session.)
5	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: Motion to adjourn? [Res. #21-11-10]
6 7	DIRECTOR JOHNEAS: So moved.
8	DIRECTOR LUSTBADER: Second.
9 10	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: All in favor?
11	(Whereupon all members responded in the affirmative.
12	CHAIRMAN KALNICK: The meeting is adjourned.
